Diagnoses – CHANGE TO FIT PATIENT

- Idopathic generalized Epilepsy (called Dravet-like)– mostly generalized seizures (has had TCs, but mostly Absence & myos now)
- PDD-NOS – autism spectrum disorder
- ADD – not hyperactive
- Sleep Apnea (central and obstructive)
- Asthma – mostly illness induced, exercise induced – not wheezing type
- Developmental Coordination Disorder (has a special needs stroller for long transport)
- Heat Sensitivity (turns bright red, has an increase in staring seizures, temperature spikes quickly. She requires air conditioner in heat, wears cooling vest to prevent overheating)

Daily Medications - CHANGE TO FIT PATIENT

- ❖ Divalproex Sodium (Depakote – Valporic Acid) – 125mg TID
- ❖ Flovent 44 Inhaler with spacer – 2 puffs BID
- ❖ Pantanase Nasal Spray – 1 spray each nostril BID
- ❖ Cytra-K Crystals – 1 packet dissolved in water BID
- ❖ Montelukast 5mg (Singulair) – 1 tab chewed nightly
- ❖ Centrum Chewables for adults – ½ tab chewed nightly
- ❖ Modified Atkins Diet – strict diet limiting carbohydrate intake daily

Rescue Medications - CHANGE TO FIT PATIENT

- ❖ For Breathing Problems - Ventolin Inhaler with spacer – 2 puffs as needed
- ❖ For Seizures - Diastat – Rectal Valium for seizure over 5 minutes – CALL 911

Negative Reactions - CHANGE TO FIT PATIENT

CHILD has had an adverse reaction to PHOSPHENYTONIN in the past, please avoid administering this drug unless she is in a true status event. DO NOT administer carbamazepine, lamotrigine, and vigabatrin are contraindicated for Dravet syndrome due to their interaction with the sodium channel. She is also extremely medication sensitive, use caution with dosing. She is also currently having an issue where her hands become very sweaty and her pulse races, we need to make note and watch to make sure she doesn't pass out.
